From the President:

In a few weeks we will be bidding to host the 72nd National Square Dance Convention[®] in Mobile. We hope everyone attending the 68th National Square Dance Convention[®] in Atlanta will join us at both the Bid Session and Parade of States – detailed information was included in the last (March) issue of the newsletter as well as in this newsletter.

Even if you are not attending the 68th NSDC in Atlanta, we hope you will join us at the **Saturn V Trail Thru Dance** at the **US Space and Rocket Center** in Huntsville Tuesday night, June 25th. Last Year, District 1 Coordinator Terry Cassis revived the North Alabama Square Dance Association (NASDA) and they are sponsoring this dance. This will be the most unique dancing experience I have ever attended! She has lined up three of the MOST POPULAR YOUNG CALLERS IN THE NATION to call at this dance – Travis Cook from Goshen, KY, Justin Russell from Memphis, TN, and Hunter Keller from Billings, MT. I can honestly say; **this will probably be the best 4** ½ **hours of dancing you will ever do - in the neatest place you will ever dance!** And more importantly - it's in ALABAMA!

Things are underway for the Alabama Convention coming up in just 3 months (August 22, 23 and 24)! ASARDA raffle tickets were sent out with District Coordinators last month. If your club has not received raffle tickets or would like more, please contact your District Coordinator. The raffle tickets are a great fund raiser for your club.

Unfortunately, due to changes in some hotel policies, we were unable to secure room rates at the Holiday Inn, Hampton Inn, and the Comfort Inn and Suites in Oxford this year. You are however welcome to book at these hotels. We have secured a rate of \$98.00 at the Fairfield by Marriott, and a rate of \$102.00 for the Courtyard by Marriott. **These rates are only good through Tuesday, July 23rd, 2019**

NEW THIS YEAR—we plan to offer a special Luau Luncheon to our dancers. We have always had a complimentary luncheon for our staff Callers & Cuers as a gesture of our appreciation for freely providing their talents for our convention. This year, we have decided to open the luncheon to our dancers as well. This will also our ASARDA fundraising event. We will offer a full buffet meal with drinks and desserts. We have hired a professional Hawaiian/Tahitian dancer to come entertain; as well as "teach" us some traditional Polynesian dances (I have already seen Margret Snyder practicing on Face-Book). This will be a great time to sit back, relax, and fellowship without having to leave the convention center to run out and eat lunch. Tickets for the Luau will be sold at the convention (based on availability) or you may purchase them in advance from any ASARDA board member for \$10 per person; beginning at the end of June.

It's great to have Tom here in North Alabama now as he is making the transition moving down from Pennsylvania. If you have not yet danced to Tom, you need to find the first opportunity you can (like July 6th!) and make a point to go dance to him. He is great with timing, choreography, and dance flow – besides knowing how to call a great dance. We are very lucky to have him join the enormously talented stable of North Alabama callers.

Speaking of which –

Darryl McMillian will be calling a special dance celebrating his 50th anniversary as a square dance caller. Darryl is a great (IMHO a world class) caller, and it isn't hard for me to believe that he has been calling so long – simply because he does it with such professionalism and style. If you want a dance that is thoroughly enjoyable, mark your calendar now to join us in Decatur on July 12th.

Our new club in Madison has been dancing 1-2 squares on Thursday nights at 6:30 at Madison Ballroom. They have picked a name – the Madison Mad Hatters and welcome any who care to join them.

We had a blast a couple weeks going by the US Space and Rocket Center to plan out the details of the Saturn V dance on June 25th, and start to work on sound checks. We have a couple new items to share with regards to the dance. First, we will be broadcasting the callers on FM for the dance, so if you have difficulty hearing, you can bring a set of in-ear speakers (ear buds meant for sports use) with an FM tuner, or if you have hearing aids that supports straight FM broadcasts, you should be able to tune into the callers and hear them perfectly well. In addition, if you are coming through with an RV rig, the USSRC has offered that dancers who would like to dry camp may do so in the parking lot at the Davidson Center on the night of the 25th for free.

You definitely do NOT want to wait to get your tickets. Remember that your ticket entitles you to not only dance under the rocket, but we have the Davidson Hall until 11:30 the night of the dance to look at all the exhibits on display. In addition, on the day before, day of, and day after the dance, if you bring your ribbon to the ticket center at the Museum, they will give you a 50% discount on the regular admission price so you can check out the rest of the Museum including Lockheed Martin's brand new, just opened Deep Space exhibit. Square Dancing club do si dos into Magnolia Springs

Cowboy boots, tennis shoes and sandals swish and scoot over the wooden floor. As directions are called out over lively music those feet stop abruptly, switch and then stop again, pausing as their dancers shuffle quickly to find the right step.

The dancers giggle when they head the wrong way. They high five and grin when they land in just the right spot. Monday night in Magnolia Springs now is square dancing night and the organizers want everyone to come and try it out.



"This is one of the best exercises in the world for your health, your mind, circulation and anxiety," said organizer Beth Zilinskas, of Foley. Zilinskas has been dancing off and on since she took square dancing as her PE credit at Jefferson Community College in the early 1970s. Now, she dances every chance she gets.

While there are small recreational groups sprinkled across Alabama and Florida's Gulf Coast, Zilinskas was excited to build a club in Baldwin County that mirrored the larger clubs in North Alabama where she used to dance. There hundreds of dancers take to the floor. She says every event is family friendly and appeals to a wide range of age groups.

"It's a family atmosphere. There is no alcohol, no smoking, none of that," Zilinskas said. "These are the most wonderful people you've ever met. We call it friendship set to music."

On Monday Zilinskas helped host the first event for the Magnolia Spring Squares. Nearly 15 people who have never square danced before came ready to learn. Patty Ping, a celebrity in the square-dancing world, who has been calling since 1981 at venues all over the globe, led a group lesson as she called the dances.

Three squares of four dancers each circled left, promenaded, rolled away and sashayed.

Jenny Brown, of Mobile, still donned her scrubs after a long work day. She headed to Magnolia Springs as soon as the workday ended to have her first square dance lesson. "This is just a great night out and a break from work," she said.

The newcomers were joined by dancers who came from Baldwin County and beyond to help lead them through the steps.

Ron Brown, of Silverhill (no relation to Jenny Brown), moved here from Houston and has been square dancing with his wife since 2006. On Monday they helped new dancers quickly master the steps. "We've met a lot of people and been all over the U.S. square dancing," he said. "It's good exercise and good for the memory."

ASARDA EDUCATION

SEATING CAN CHANGE THE SOCIAL ATMOSPHERE OF A DANCE

This account from Jerry Junck describes a seemingly trivial change in the way dancers are seated during breaks which he believes has improved the social atmosphere of the group and lead to an increase in the number of dancers attending his dance. Something to think about ...

For years I had always set up my hall with two rows of chairs in the back, side by side. Never really gave that a thought, but did it because "that is what I've always done." That section is a 20-foot-wide area behind a row of four columns. Too small an area to dance, but great for seating away from the floor.

Two seasons ago, my activity director decided to leave tables set up in that area all the time. I wasn't all that sure about it, but that is what she wanted. They set two rectangular tables set end to end. Each table will each seat 4 people on a side, and there are ten sets of these tables. That seats 160 people. Using my old method of chairs side by side, I could not seat that many dancers.

What I have found is that dancers LOVE those tables. To the extent that I believe it has contributed to the growth of this dance in these last two seasons. Also, people are arriving earlier to "stake out" their tables for their friends. This has given dancers a place to put their drinks, their bags, and plates, if we have treats, and a place to put their elbows, if nothing else. It has increased the social aspect of the evening tremendously. Much easier to visit with people across the table rather than down the line beside them on chairs.

As an aside, I just called a dance here in Nebraska this afternoon for a club I started 51 years ago. They are not a big group anymore, but they also set up tables for people to sit around, rather than on the benches around the hall. It was amazing to watch how much they enjoyed being able to visit with each other.

DANCING ON TUESDAY?

When I decided to highlight some clubs that are not in the news very often, it did not dawn on me that they all meet on Tuesdays. When you think about however, Tuesday is a really good day to go dancing. You are rested from the weekend, and it's the day before a lot of people go back to church.

When you are in the Trussville area on Tuesday afternoon, **T-SQUARES** is the club to visit. They usually begin dancing at 2PM and finish around 4. Just in time to go to a Tuesday night dance if you wish. They are located at the Trussville Senior Center off Oak Street. Warning: You must be at least 55 to be admitted into the Senior Center where they dance. On a busy day you may have to park in the trees on the approach, but don't worry it is ok.

T-SQUARES is not the normal club you are used to visiting. They have been in their present format since 2008, after two previous clubs were combined. Then back to dancing. You will see a lot of friends there as T-SQUARES membership is composed of a lot of dual membership dancers, and you will always be welcomed and leave with warm sense of friendship. So now, its 4PM and time to decide which direction to go next. North to Cullman to be with FRIENDSHIP SQUARES, or South to Montgomery to dance with BEAUX AND BELLES.

If you decided to head North, you may have to hurry a bit as they begin dancing at 6:30 PM and again, it is Tuesday. Even though I missed the East Point Community Center on my first visit, it is easy to locate, just pay attention as the building sits above the road on a knoll but has a turning lane to as gravel driveway and there is plenty of room to park. It is located on Highway 69 just west of the Highway 157, a few miles East of Cullman. There is a very bright, Jet Pep gas station across the road from the center. FRIENDSHIP SQUARES is another newer club hat was started 10 years ago.

I first heard about the club when Beth Zilinskas told me about a new club while at the Eastern Wranglers July 4th Dance. She and Tommy and Hulda Shaefers, Mike and Doris Vinson, and Jim Nichols combined to start a new club in Cullman. Roy & Connie Dutton were to be the callers and they originally danced at the Cullman County Museum. Later on, they moved to the East Point Community Center where you will now find them every Tuesday from 6:30 PM until 8:30PM, except on Election Day. Jim Melton is now the caller. Roy, by the way is calling at the Jasper Cub every Thursday night. On Election Day and at Christmas the dancers meet for dinner and fellowship at a selected restaurant.

Casual attire is the normal, but ladies, do not be afraid to wear your favorite dress and petticoats. Again, you will be warmly welcomed by the members and by Jim. Elizabeth is taking college classes and Edna has had to stop dancing due to health concerns, but the rest of the gang will normally be there. Even if it is not Christmas, you probably find "Santa" dancing with his favorite elf. Calvin keeps his beard all year round so he will be prepared for the "Holidays". Dance, visit, enjoy a snack, you will have a great time, don't forget to return to **FRIENDSHIP SQUARES**, the name says it all.

If you decided to head South to dance with BEAUX AND BELLES, you may still have to hurry a bit to catch the workshop that begins at 6:30. Dancing then goes from 7PM until 9PM with Larry Belcher as the Club caller. The last time we visited however, Kevin was there in place of Larry. The Club meets every Tuesday evening in the North Hall of the MASDA Center, which is on the right side of the building as you enter the parking lot. The DIXIE PLUS Club, with Al Stevens calling, will also be dancing in the MASDA Center, in the South hall. There is no interference however from the adjoining hall, and the acoustics are good. As most of you know, MASDA is in the process of procuring a buyer for the building, and hopefully in the near future. Presently, BEAUX AND BELLES are still at the MASDA Hall, but are investigating different locations to dance when the sale is final. You might want to call ahead to be sure. MASDA Hall is located at the end of Poplar Street, and Poplar St. is the only way into the parking lot. You access Poplar St. From I-85 North at exit 3, left at the bottom of the ramp onto Ann Street, and then left again onto Poplar St.

Becky and I were welcomed by every member, dancing that Tuesday. That is a really warm memory from any club you may visit. Again, dress was varied, but don't be afraid to wear you finest. You will not be the only gal there in square dance attire. There will be lines between tips, with announced plus tips during the evening. While you are resting or having some refreshment, you can browse the flyer cabinet or the Clothes closet. There is plenty to choose from for women and men, and it is open all the time, with very reasonable prices. I am sure when Larry is there, you will be surprised with some new emphasis on his favorite basic calls. He loves to throw out a partner trade or 1/2 sashay when you least expect it. You will have a wonderful experience and see several clubs represented, and old friends attending.

Visiting is the key to promoting square dancing and having a great time no matter where you go. See some old friends and make some new ones, especially on a Tuesday night. Remember, dancers will likely visit your home club if you have been to see them at their home club.

<u>UPDATE</u> on Alabama's Bid for the 72nd National Square Dance Convention® in 2023

We are ready to present our bid to the National Executive Committee (NEC) at the 68th National Square Dance Convention® in Atlanta this June! If you have never been to a National Convention, you should really plan to attend – but keep in mind – this isn't one of those weekend dances you can just show up at the door and pay to dance one night. There are no split tickets and, as most of you know,



the closer it gets, the higher the price. Registration begins at \$50 per person (\$25 for Youth). After the Pre-Convention (18 months before the scheduled NSDC) the price increases to \$60 per person. After May 1st prior to the scheduled convention, the price increases to \$75 per person. So if you show up at the door in Atlanta, the price will be \$75 per person – whether you dance for one night or the full 4 nights! The convention begins on Wednesday night with the Trail End dance. It continues all day Thursday, Friday and Saturday and concludes with the last after party Saturday night from 10:00-11:00! There are non-stop dancing opportunities all day and night – there are also many education sessions, clinics (workshops), exhibition dancers, and a host of other activities going on which include sew and save projects. Dance leaders (callers, cuers, contra prompters & line dance leaders) from across the country and around the world come to National Square Dance Conventions®. Don't be surprised to have a couple of foreign callers on the stage! Square Dance calls are in the English Language around the world – sometimes the pronunciations and accents can really be difficult to understand – and also FUN and entertaining!

If you will be attending the 68th NSDC in Atlanta:

For all of you graciously volunteering to help us with the 72nd NSDC who have never attended a National Convention – attending this National Convention would be a great opportunity to see all the "wheels in motion".

Indiana will present their bid to host the 71st NSDC in Evansville, Indiana first. They are allotted 20 minutes for the presentation – followed by a brief Q&A. We will follow the same process – probably beginning around 9:30. We (Tom & Tina Wilkins), Don & Susan Wolford, and our Mobile Team – Jerry Bousard with Visit Mobile, Melanie Pierce with the Mobile Convention Center, and Cameron Coppejans with Renaissance Hotels will present our plans for hosting the NSDC in Mobile! We have a PowerPoint presentation with slides and videos. There will be a reserved seating area for our bid committee – which is YOU: all of our Alabama dancers (and supporters from other states) on the front right side of the room. When we finish the presentation, we, along with all of YOU in the front of the audience will "carefully" toss Moon pies to the audience (behind you) to add some "excitement", uniqueness and FUN! Later that afternoon around 3:00 we (Wilkins, Wolfords, and Mobile Team) will have a closed door meeting with the NEC to answer more specific questions.


